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Founder's Message

The future is bright because our roots are deep. Three years ago, we set out to develop a three-year organizational strategic plan. It was the beginning of COVID; the world was a bit chaotic, and our work rhythms were unpredictable. In many ways, things were much different than they are now.

Our organizational size, scope, and reach was smaller back then. At **UrbanPromise Honduras**, we were still less than a year into the transition of Londin's leadership over Honduras operations. We had only recently graduated our first **UPCEL** (**UrbanPromise Center of Entrepreneurial Leadership**) cohort, and the program was on pause until there was more international stability for travel and recruitment. Our development team was small, and our capacity to lead through complex financial situations was limited. The idea of purchasing land in Copán and developing a **Campus** was exactly that, a tiny seed but with great potential.

The key phrase that came out of that strategic planning phase was—Cultivating Sustainability. We have grown in many ways since creating that strategic plan, ways that we have developed roots, specifically, leadership roots. There is so much to celebrate!

Londin thrives as UPH Director. He bleeds the colors of the Honduran flag, his passion for the next generation of leaders is palpable, and it is contagious as he continues to attract and develop an incredible staff team at UPH.

Silvia leaves her fingerprint on the organization's financial strategy as we implement new governmental requirements in Honduras and uphold high standards at the international level.

Developing and cultivating our network of resources is a blessing, a privilege, and a challenge. David keeps things spicy and fun and is the definition of "estoy a la orden", doing whatever is needed to serve and advance our goals. He brings a local perspective that will be critical to our growth in the coming years.

Our UPCEL team, Jorge and Carolina, have re-launched the Fellowship, graduating our 2022 cohort and welcoming our 2023 cohort; bringing consistency, professionalism, and leadership to shape a branch of UrbanPromise that will invest in hundreds of leaders for years to come and thereby impact thousands of youth throughout Latin America.

With an eye for our impact across Latin America, Kris brings structure and depth to our relationship with **Affiliates** as new projects launch and flourish. His leadership helped guide us through one of the darkest moments, the San Pedro Sula event, something that, despite being so dark, was also a moment when we learned how to hope and see God's provision in miraculous ways.

Three years ago, we were a thin and, unfortunately, fragile team. The future is bright because our roots are deep. The main branches of **UrbanPromise in Latin America** are strong because of the leaders surrounding them.



OVERVIEW OF OUR HISTORY



It all started with a desire to see a vibrant community where young people thrive.

We started as a team of three foreigners, focusing on the children and youth of Copán Ruinas, and we formed a comprehensive support network for participants through AfterSchool Programs, Summer Camps, and Youth Leadership.

The work grew in quantity and quality while also growing in our goal of equipping and raising local leadership. The vision has been alive for almost 14 years, and we have taken big steps, from an annual reach of just 30 children to now impacting over 500 children and youth annually in Copán Ruinas alone.

Our small team of 3 foreign staff has evolved into a courageous, innovative, and humble team of 32 local Honduran staff.

Amid the success we experienced in Copán with UPH, we connected with other leaders who had a similar dream.

So, we started inviting leaders to visit Copán; to spend time with us, learn about the UPH model and equip themselves with practical skills to launch a non-profit. Those invitations are now formalized as a Fellowship, in which we accept a new cohort each year to experience our model.

That experience is the inspiration they need to realize their visions for vibrant communities where young people thrive.

With each cohort, leaders graduate with

a dream of launching new projects, what we call Affiliate Sites. So far, we have representation in three countries with five sites. That expansion creates exponential growth in reaching more youth; and naturally, we see more vibrant communities where young people thrive.

With previous annual reports we celebrated the results of our pioneering initiative, UrbanPromise Honduras. While that remains the heartbeat of our organization, it is also clear that the vision is alive and thriving beyond just Honduras.

We are learning how to communicate our broader impact, to you, our faithful friends who stand alongside us in multi-layered support and love.

Thank you for your grace as we learn how to tell this story; an ever-increasing group of courageous leaders inspired by faith, relentlessly investing themselves in others, and trying to stay out of the way as God works miracles.

God's love is contagious. And we have seen that the UPH model is contagious. We are eager to see how it expands in Latin America.

URBAN PROMISE HONDURAS





Trekker trips motivate students to learn from their outdoor experiences and carry that motivation into their studies. Our leaders design activities to help develop students' teamwork, leadership, and decision-making skills.

We believe the experiences we have during adolescence directly influence the direction and path we follow for the rest of our lives. An essential part of those experiences is the relationships formed with positive and caring adult role models—those committed to teaching our youth that each individual is wonderfully created in God's image and poised for future success.



ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE (AIR)

Art in all its forms works by going deep rather than broad, immersing itself in an image, a narrative. While the numbers and reports allow us to gauge the breadth of our impact, art constantly reminds us of that one child, that one youth, this one moment.

We started AIR as an avenue to help foster creativity and innovation while we simultaneously grow larger as an organization.

Artists help us engage others and our environment with the curiosity of a small child.

AIR will invite one artist annually to serve for 12 months and use their God-given skills to be a creative storyteller, drawing out the encouraging, transformative work happening around us, celebrating God's presence with us, and highlighting the miraculous moments that are easy to miss.

Marrisa Thornberry was our Artist-In-Residence for 2022, storytelling primarily through painting, and she culminated with a phenomenal art exhibition that left many in awe. She also helped design the program for long-term sustainability, and we now look forward to our next artist, who will lead us in 2023.








URBANPROMISE CENTER FOR ENTREPRENEURIAL LEADERSHIP



UPCEL is our 12-month fellowship that equips visionary leaders to successfully launch new entrepreneurial efforts that support vulnerable youth. At the end of the year, fellows are given the opportunity to present their project proposals and request seed capital. This year our Board of Directors approved seed capital for three new affiliates:

Fundación Mi Prójimo (Alina López: Honduras), Caja del Saber Integral (Laura Franco: Colombia), and Fundación Juventud Empoderada (Norma Pérez and Flor López: México).

This year, four visionary leaders graduated from our Fellowship and are now equipped with the tools to realize their dreams and launch projects that will serve the vulnerable youth of their community.



URBANPROMISE CENTER FOR ENTREPRENEURIAL LEADERSHIP









Our theory-based curriculum starts with leadership development. It explores the Latin American cultural context, crafting a holistic response, strategic planning for project development, and communicating the vision across networks to see it become a reality.

Fellows become more confident in their skills and develop more clarity around their vision as they are exposed to various training opportunities in theory and practice. They are unique and separate activities yet work together to create a servant leader.

Our fellows immerse themselves in hands-on training and practical experience by rotating through programs at UrbanPromise Honduras—experiencing our AfterSchool programs, Summer Camps, Youth Programs, and UrbanTrekkers. They also tour other non-profits in Copán Ruinas and throughout the region to learn and adapt best practices.





Our connections across Latin America are expanding. We find potential Fellowship candidates through strategic partnerships at universities, churches, and friends within our network. These alliances have strengthened our ability to identify visionary leaders that are looking for an opportunity like UPCEL.

Extensive interviews and a rigorous application process are conducted with each applicant to discover more about their personalities, entrepreneurial ambitions, and hopes for the youth of their communities. We look for a courageous yet humble passion that drives people to want to change the world in which they reside.

We take time to pray and discern as a team during the application process. Accepting one leader to our Fellowship is a 12-month commitment. Still, at the same time, it is a more indefinite commitment to walk alongside them in leadership as they launch affiliate sites. These are daunting but exciting decisions toward seeing the UP Latin America vision become a reality.

AFFILIATES

After leaders have participated in our Fellowship, they are ready to leave the nest and launch their own projects. We call the new projects, Affiliates (operating as a new and autonomous non-profit). This is one of the most exciting parts of our model: visionary leaders returning home, fully equipped with the tools necessary to put their dreams into action.

Now, as Executive Directors of a new non-profit, these leaders begin sharing the vision with members of their communities, finding others who will join the cause, identifying program locations, and above all, painting a picture of transformation for community leaders and parents inviting them to be part of the process. These are the first small steps for our fellowship graduates to see their seeds of hope take root.

With the launch of new affiliates, we are seeing our vision realized of communities throughout Latin America, where young people thrive.

In March, we made our final payment on the land and were able to make the complete purchase due to generous contributions towards our capital campaign (no loans were needed!). The property is 13 acres, located 2 miles from town, with access via a dirt road. A creek runs through the property, beautifully nestled down in the woods behind what will be our natural amphitheater (a large 60-year-old Guanacaste tree serves as the amphitheater backdrop!).

Abnormally relentless rains slowed construction progress and forced us to get creative about the next steps. However, a beautiful dream sprouted.

Campus

With local architects, we salvaged an existing house (Casa Retoño [Sprout]) — transforming a dilapidated, unusable space ready for demolition into a beautiful two-bedroom house, including a kitchen and balcony with hammocks to overlook a priceless view where macaws visit daily in the afternoon.



With the addition of Casa Retoño, we could host our staff retreat on the campus, along with several UrbanTrekker activities, team meetings, and youth gatherings. The future continues to look bright as we begin 2023 with a beautiful dedication ceremony with beloved guests from the UrbanPromise family, and we take inaugural steps towards further campus development.



We look forward to building a large multi-purpose pavilion to seat 100+ people in time to host our 2023 UPLAM Summit in May, along with the finishing touches on Casa Retoño, creating paths to connect the spaces we use, purchasing a small SUV for more accessible transportation, building an outdoor BBQ and bonfire area, and developing our soccer field.




